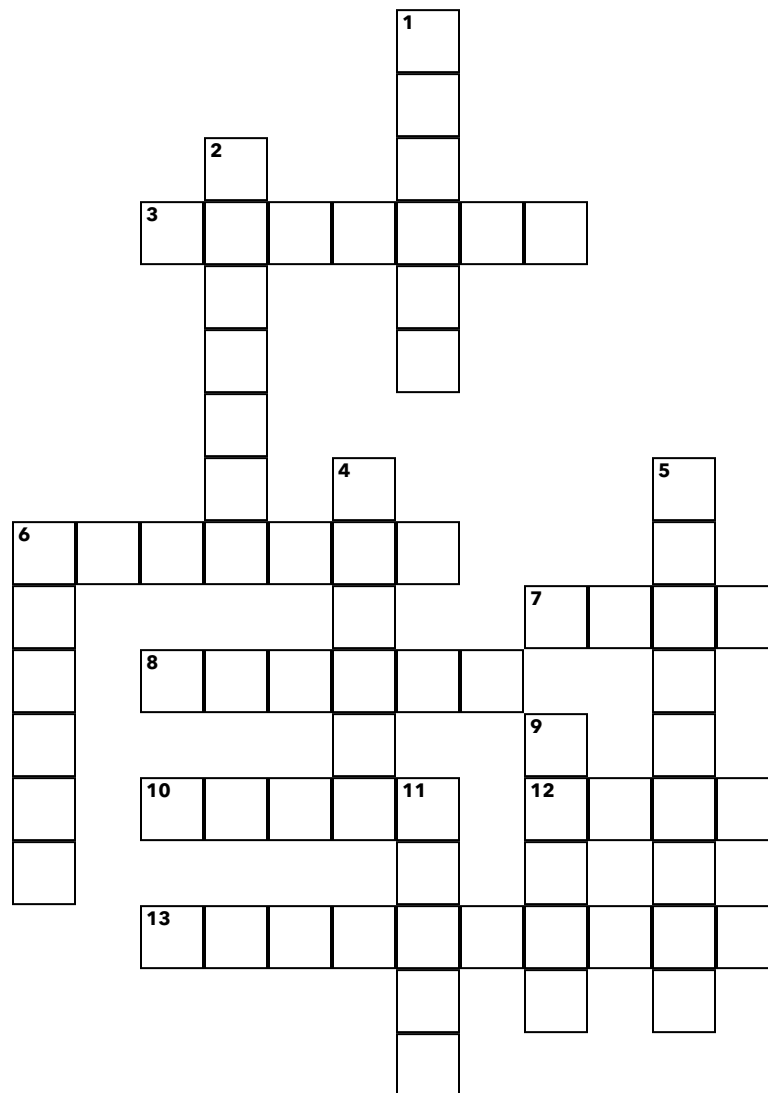


Fateh Singh and the Last Pound

- 10 Warm winter clothing the sangat donated to keep people at the shelter warm.

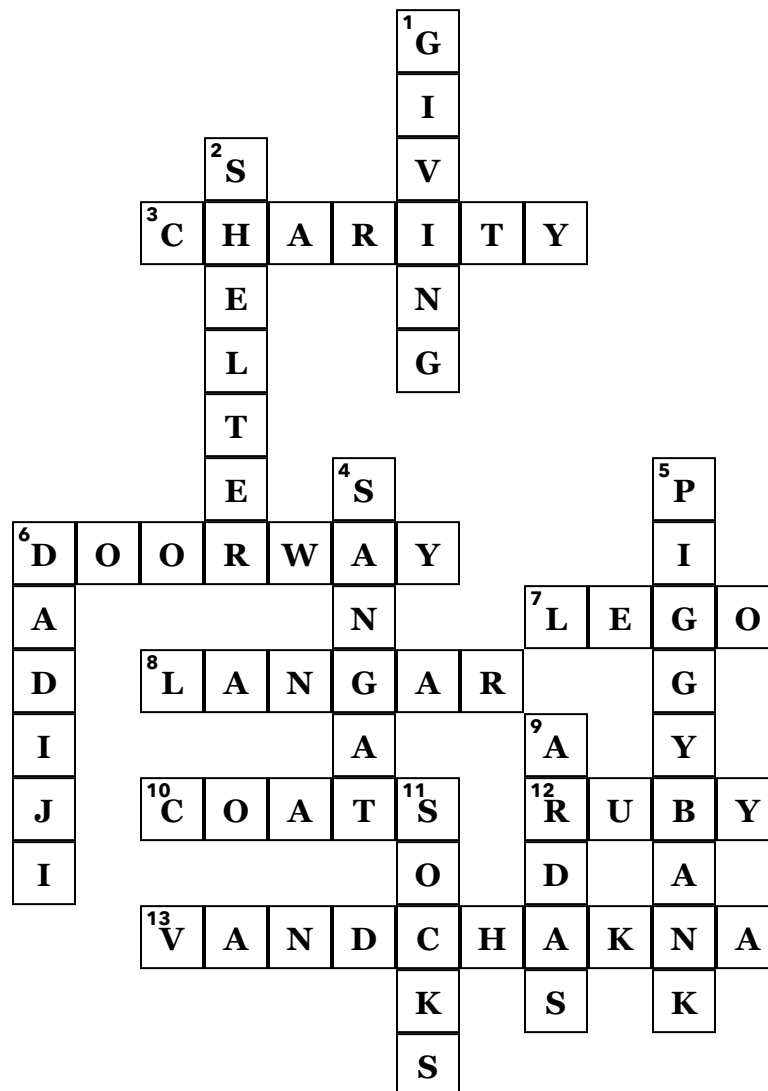
DOWN
