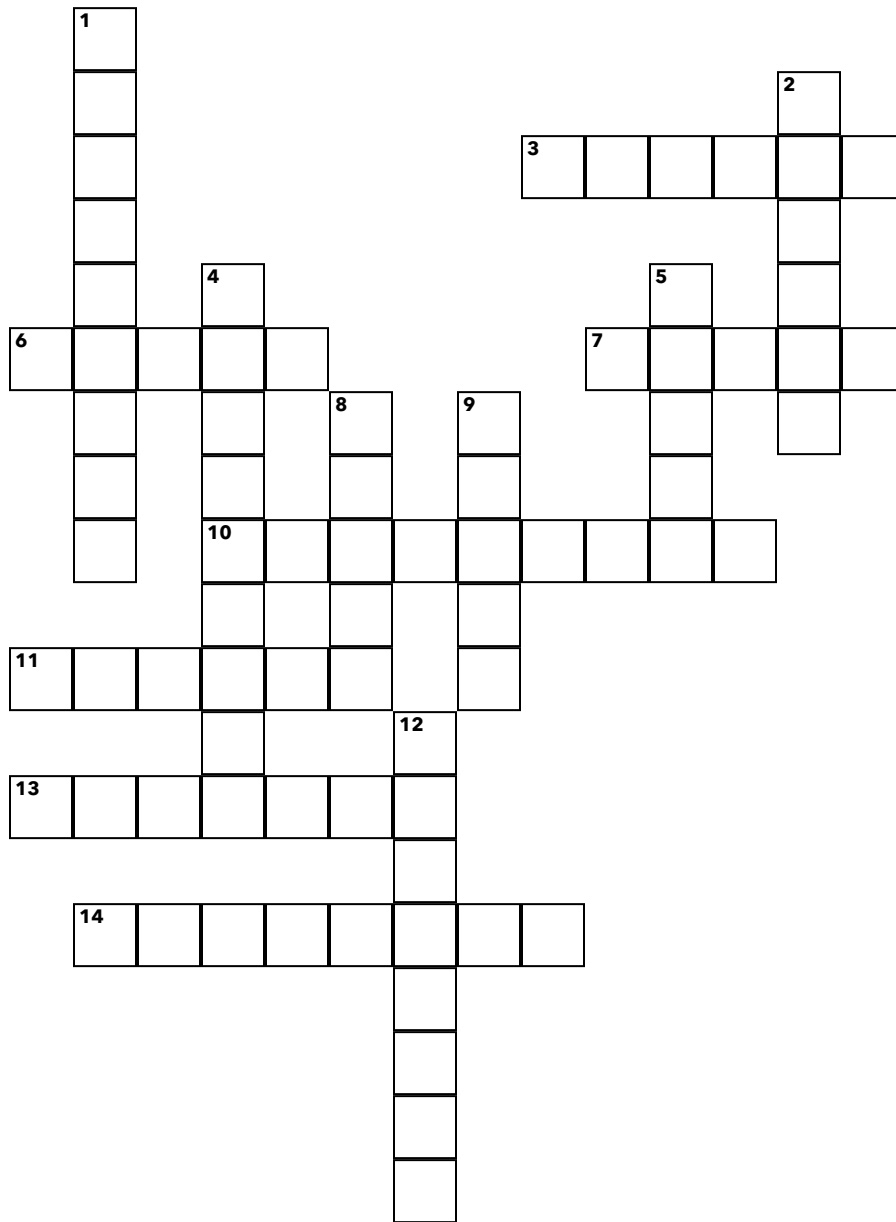


# Guru Nanak Dev Ji: The First Guru

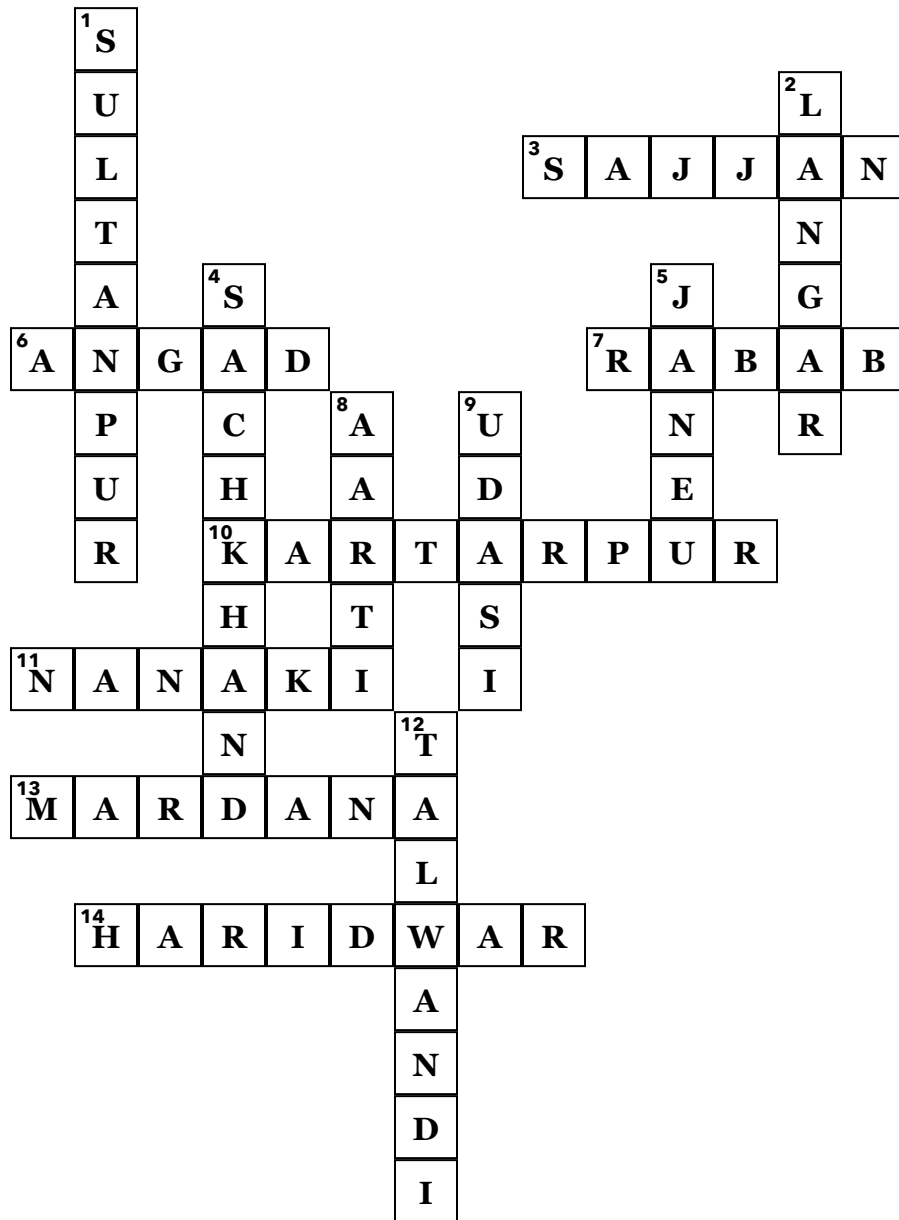
